TOPIC for DISCUSSION

Higher Learning Commission Interim Monitoring Report

REPORT:

The Higher Learning Commission Institutional Actions Council (IAC) took formal action on the site team report on July 18, 2023. The IAC reaffirmed a 10-year accreditation for Butler and will allow Butler to continue to use the current "Open Pathway" process for accreditation purposes for the next ten years.

The site team's final report identified Butler met all Core Components except Core Component 2.C related to Governance. This Core Component was "Met with Concerns" and requires an interim monitoring report be submitted to HLC to address the concerns and show progress in meeting this Core Component.

In order to comprehensively address the concerns noted, the interim monitoring report will need to include narrative that includes the Board's clear understanding of Core Component 2C and the subcomponents which include:

2.C: The governing board of the institution is autonomous to make decisions in the best interest of the institution in compliance with board policies and to ensure the institution's integrity.

1: The governing board is trained and knowledgeable so that it makes informed decisions with respect to the institution's financial and academic policies and practices; the board meets its legal and fiduciary responsibilities.

2: The governing board's deliberations reflect priorities to preserve and enhance the institution.

3: The governing board reviews the reasonable and relevant interests of the institution's internal and external constituencies during its decision-making deliberations.

4: The governing board preserves its independence from undue influence on the part of donors, elected officials, ownership interests or other external parties.

5: The governing board delegates day-to-day management of the institution to the institution's administration and expects the institution's faculty to oversee academic matters.

With specific examples of concern noted in the site team report, one of the report's focus areas will also need to be a clear understanding and respect of the Board's role, the administration's role including the president, vice presidents and associate vice presidents, and the academic Deans and faculty roles.

Dr. Phil Speary will help lead the discussion related to the site team report and the IAC documentation needed to complete the interim monitoring as he has 30+ years as a HLC peer reviewer, site team chair and IAC member. An extension has been granted for the report to be submitted by March 31, 2024.

Trustee Good moved to add the KACC Quarterly Report to standing reports. Trustee Jolly seconded the motion. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent. Trustee Smith made a motion to move consent item C.A relating to signage at the Redler Institute of Culinary Arts to Action Item IX-E. Trustee Braungardt seconded the motion. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent. Trustee Winslow moved to

approve the agenda as amended. Trustee Good seconded. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent.

RECOGNITIONS

Dr. Krull recognized Kaelib Harp for receiving the ACTE Region V Post-Secondary Outstanding Business Education Student Award. Kaelib is a member of Butler's chapter of FBLA and serves as State FBLA president and National VP of Financial Development.

Dr. Krull also recognized Great Western Dining, who has been named the El Dorado Chamber of Commerce Business of the Month. Great Western provides catering services for events both on-campus and in the broader community.

Dr. Krull also recognized Trustee Good's December birthday.

Trustee Winslow was recognized by Dr. Krull for her service on the Board of Trustees, as this meeting is her last full meeting as a sitting member.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Brad Beachy, retired faculty member provided comments via Zoom regarding the negotiations process.

STANDING REPORTS

Student Government Association – There was no SGA report this month, as students were involved in Vocal Music activities.

Operational Staff (YouTube @ 16:45) – Zach Cannady shared that OpStaff sold 195 Midwest Mixes for their Holiday Fundraiser. There is no January meeting, so the next OpStaff meeting will be in February in Andover.

Professional Employees (YouTube @ 17:55) – Dr. Terry Sader wished the Board a Happy Holiday season on behalf of the faculty.

Board Finance Committee (YouTube @ 18:24) – Trustee Jolly reported that the finance committee did not meet this month, therefore there was no report to share.

Foundation Board Report (YouTube @ 18:32) – Trustee Rhodes shared that the Foundation Board met in November. He shared that the fair market value of the investment portfolio is approximately \$14.3 million, which is slightly down from the previous quarter. The annual audit has been completed with no notes or issues and has been approved by the Board. He shared that in follow up of the Board of Trustees decision last month to not act on the piece of property adjacent to the Redler Institute, the Foundation Board made the decision to move forward and purchase that property. There is no obligation on the college for any specific use, but they felt from a donor relations standpoint and to preserve the opportunity to utilize the property in the future, that they would move forward with the purchase. They will close on the land next month.

President's Report (YouTube @ 20:05) – Dr. Krull thanked Trustee Winslow, Trustee Rhodes and Trustee Good for their attendance at the annual Legislative Luncheon that was held on November 28. Representatives Will Carpenter, Scott Hill and Senator Mike Fagg were also in attendance along with Heather Morgan, Executive Director of KACC and an array of Butler leadership.

Planning and preparations for the Butler Benefit Auction on March 1 are underway. More information will be forthcoming, but sponsorship solicitation and event planning is underway.

Dr. Krull and Trustee Jolly traveled to Seward County Community College for the KACC Quarterly Meeting a couple of weeks ago.

Dr. Krull shared the Executive Summary of the Lightcast study that was recently completed around the economic impact of community colleges in the state of Kansas. The statewide study will be released later. She highlighted that Butler's ten-county primary market's total economic impact is more than \$754 million.

Nurse's Pinning is this Thursday, December 14 at 7pm at the Performing Arts Center.

Dr. Krull also shared photos of the new Student Pledge displays in the 600 Building, El Dorado Student Union and Andover Student Union.

Educational Facilities Authority Report (YouTube @ 25:19) – EFABC will meet tomorrow morning, December 13.

KACC Quarterly Report (YouTube @ 25:35) – Trustee Jolly shared that the group of Presidents and Trustees met in Liberal December 1-2. They discussed the Lightcast reports. They also discussed issues like the simplification of the FAFSA and how that will impact our operations. There was a tour of the Allied Health Building. KACC officers were also elected, with the slate remaining the same as last year. Topics also included active shooters, NIL and the process of helping athletes navigate that while protecting the image of the college. They also heard from LevelUp Kansas. The 2024 Legislative Agenda was also adopted. They also discussed current trends in higher education, including alumni perceptions. Heather Morgan will also be providing new trustee training via zoom. She also mentioned that several colleges in the system have presidential vacancies, and KACC is always willing to assist with presidential searches. The next event will be Donuts with Legislators on January 18 at 7am in Topeka.

BOARD STRATEGIC DISCUSSION – ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES

There were no discussion items this month.

BOARD ACTION ITEMS

- A. Property & Liability Insurance (YouTube @ 31:10) – Kent Williams shared that he and Dr. Krull met with both Chris Conrade of KERMP and Ryan Murry of ICI Insurance to determine the best options for property and liability insurance going forward based on the current market. ICI did not feel they would be able to come up with a competitive bid based on price and deductible. The administration recommends staying with KERMP this year and evaluating going forward. KERMP has advised the pool to prepare for a 20% increase this year. Dr. Krull shared that one of the main issues of concern is the deductible. Most other carriers outside of KERMP carry a much higher deductible than is currently in place. No action was required since the Board has decided to remain with KERMP.
- B. Retirement of Timothy Logue & Warren Klaasen (35:44) – Ireland Turner shared that Tim Logue has been with Butler for 9 years as Supervisor at the Andover Campus. Warren Klaasen has been with Butler for 5 years, starting as a lead HVAC tech and

supervisor over the physical plant operations for the last two years. Trustee Smith moved to accept the resignations (retirements) of Timothy Logue and Warren Klaasen. Trustee Winslow seconded. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent.

- C. 2000 Building HVAC Rooftop Replacement (YouTube @ 37:10) – Ireland Turner shared that the Clifford/Stone Room has two rooftop units. One of the units' main condensing coils has broken down, and it is more affordable to replace the unit than repair the coil. An RFP went out and four bids were returned. Dean Norris was lowest bid, and he recommends proceeding with Dean Norris, as there are no Butler County mechanical contractors that can complete this work. Trustee Smith approved the proposal from Dean Norris as presented. Trustee Winslow seconded. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent.
- D. RICA Building New Signage (YouTube @ 39:15) – The culinary building signage proposal is to add two new signs (replacing white BCC sign with a purple one that stands out better, and large Butler logo on the North side). The proposal also includes modifications to two existing signs that do not meet Vantage Property covenants. Trustee Smith asked for clarification about the price of the various parts of the bid. There was discussion about whether the College legally had to meet the covenant requirements, Ray Connell will be contacted to review the Vantage Property covenants and the requirements to meet them. Trustee Smith moved to approve sign A and sign B, and to table sign C and sign D until next month when more information can be provided. Trustee Winslow seconded. On roll call vote, the motion passed 6-0, with Trustee Sherrer absent.

2024-2025 High School Articulation Agreements

REPORT:

Career Pathways incorporate the combined value of academic and technical course work so that, within each pathway, students can design their own career plan. Articulation Agreements between Unified School Districts and Butler Community College have been created to assist students in making a seamless transition from their secondary to post-secondary education at Butler without duplication of course study within a specific career pathway. Butler Community College faculty have reviewed the course competencies and have negotiated the following agreements for the 2024-2025 academic year.

High Schools offer the courses according to the KS Course Codes to their students. When a student attends Butler after high school graduation, the Articulation Agreement allows the student to receive credit for the course they took while in high school on their Butler transcript.

High School Articulation Agreement 2024-2025

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between USD 267-Renwick (Andale High School) and Butler Community College, is made in order to provide high school students the option to earn an Associate of Applied Science Degree, Certificate, an Associates of Arts in Mass Communication, Sociology/Social Work or an Associates of Science in Sociology/Social Work.

THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- Any party may advertise the program and/or advise students that this option is available.
- Andale High School will supply all of the courses and competencies with no exchange of reimbursement between or among the institutions.
- Credit may only be applied toward a certificate program, an Associates of Applied Science program, or an Associates of Arts or Sciences program identified above. Credits are not intended for transfer to a baccalaureate institution. Students will need to verify transferability with the baccalaureate receiving institution.
- This agreement will be in effect from the graduation date of the student through a date not to exceed 15 months after high school graduation.
- Students must successfully complete the competencies in the high school articulated course(s) with a final grade of 'C' or better to qualify for college credit. High school transcripts must be submitted with the articulation credit application.
- The high school articulated courses will be reported on the college transcript upon completion of the articulation credit application and review of high school transcript. Students will receive CP (Credit Pending) college credit for the approved high school articulated course work until 12 credit hours have been earned at Butler Community College. After 12 hours have been earned the student must notify the Registrar's Office to have the CP changed to CR (Credit Received).
- *High school students qualifying for tuition assistance through the Kansas CTE Initiative may submit a completed articulation credit application and high school transcript for special processing prior to graduation. Upon approval, articulated credit will be posted directly to the student transcript at Butler Community College as Credit Received (CR).*
- This Agreement may be revised by mutual agreement and shall be modified in the event of cancellation, discontinuance or disapproval of any course or program by the Kansas Board of Regents.
- This agreement will be reviewed annually for possible changes, improvement, or enhancements.
- This agreement does not guarantee admittance to a college or a program.

High School Articulation Agreement 2024-2025

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between USD 385-Andover and Butler Community College, is made in order to provide high school students the option to earn an Associate of Applied Science Degree, a Certificate, or an Associates of Arts in Mass Communication or Sociology/Social Work, or an Associates of Science in Sociology/Social Work.

THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- Any party may advertise the program and/or advise students that this option is available.
- USD 385-Andover will supply all of the courses and competencies with no exchange of reimbursement between or among the institutions.
- Credit may only be applied toward a certificate program, an Associates of Applied Science program, or an Associates of Arts or Sciences program identified above. Credits are not intended for transfer to a baccalaureate institution. Students will need to verify transferability with the baccalaureate receiving institution.
- This agreement will be in effect from the graduation date of the student through a date not to exceed 15 months after high school graduation.
- Students must successfully complete the competencies in the high school articulated course(s) with a final grade of 'C' or better to qualify for college credit. High school transcripts must be submitted with the articulation credit application.
- The high school articulated courses will be reported on the college transcript upon completion of the articulation credit application and review of high school transcript. Students will receive CP (Credit Pending) college credit for the approved high school articulated course work until 12 credit hours have been earned at Butler Community College. After 12 hours have been earned the student must notify the Registrar's Office to have the CP changed to CR (Credit Received).
- *High school students qualifying for tuition assistance through the Kansas CTE Initiative may submit a completed articulation credit application and high school transcript for special processing prior to graduation. TOPIC for ACTION
Proposed Revisions to the Early Childhood Education AAS, Early Childhood Education certificate (Cert B), and Early Childhood Business certificate (Cert A)

REPORT:

The Butler Community College Early Childhood Education Department is seeking Board approval for proposed revisions to the Early Childhood Education AAS, Early Childhood Education Certificate, and the Early Childhood Business Administration Certificate. Board approval is required in order to submit proposed revisions to the Kansas Board of Regents for consideration and approval.

The Early Childhood Education Department prepares students to become teachers of children ages 0-5 at early childhood learning centers. Students who complete the AAS degree have the capacity to teach and eventually become directors or owners of early childhood learning centers that serve up to 100 children. The Early Childhood Education certificate is a foundational certificate that allows our students to enter the workforce as early childhood teachers. The new Early Childhood Business Administration certificate is designed for students who have accumulated years of early childhood teaching experience and would like to develop the knowledge and skills to become an owner or director of a small early childhood learning center.

After reviewing all three pathways, Cathy Gray, Lead Early Childhood Education, has identified opportunities for improving operations and service to students. First, CD 222-Childcare Administration is deemed an advanced-level course and should not be taken by students without sufficient Early Childhood Education knowledge or experience. However, without a prerequisite, any student may self-enroll or be enrolled by advisors who may not be familiar with any requirements. So we are proposing to add a prerequisite to CD 222, which would require students to complete at least 21 credits of Early Childhood Education courses. This change would allow us to pair CD 222 with CD 295-Early Childhood Leadership as our two advanced-level courses with the same prerequisite. Therefore, we would ensure that only students who are prepared for these courses will be allowed to enroll.

We will then revise the Early Childhood Education AAS by moving all foundation CD courses into the first and second terms and move the two advanced CD courses into the third and fourth terms. We will also revise the Early Childhood Education certificate by replacing CD 222 and CD 295 with CD 115-Creative Experiences for Young Children and CD 125-Child Nutrition, Health, and Safety, thus making this certificate a truly foundational-level certificate. Finally, we will revise the Early Childhood Business Administrative certificate by replacing CD 123-Principles of Early Childhood Education 2 with CD 295, thus making this certificate a truly advanced-level certificate. These revisions would allow students to complete the Early Childhood Education certificate to enter the workforce, then pursue the Early Childhood Business Administration certificate to become an owner or director of a small early childhood learning center, then pursue the AAS to become a director of an early childhood learning center that serves up to 100 children by completing the four general education courses that are on the AAS degree but not on either of the certificates. This would create a truly stackable-credential process for Early Childhood Education students. These revisions are unanimously supported by the Early Childhood Education Advisory Committee.

Since Butler offers all coursework for the Early Childhood Education AAS, Cert B, and Cert A, and already has all the required equipment, facilities, supplies, instructional materials, faculty, and industry support, there will be no increased cost to the institution to support revisions to the Early Childhood Education curriculum.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Board approval to revise the Early Childhood Education AAS degree, the Early Childhood Education certificate (Cert B), and the Early Childhood Business certificate (Cert A).

RECOMMENDED FUNDING SOURCE:

Student tuition and fees currently fund all courses included on the Early Childhood Education AAS degree, the Early Childhood Education certificate (Cert B), and the Early Childhood Business certificate (Cert A); no additional funding source needed.

Narrative

Four of the Inclusion Council Action Teams focus their activities in the area of this Priority 1(b): Provide multicultural/global experiences for students, faculty, and staff. Those teams are the Sensitivity Based Training team, the Development of Student Leadership team, the Prioritizing Mental Health team, and the Affinity and Alliance team.

Current Outcomes

- The action team focused on ensuring the mental well-being of our students and staff remains heavily focused on messaging and awareness of the services that are offered on our campuses, as well as community resources. They continue to work toward increasing the dissemination of information using digital signage and email distributions. This team hosted Suicide Prevention workshops, as well as several events for Sexual Assault Awareness month. These events included the “What Were They Wearing” display and the “Believe Them First” campaign. Additionally, they coordinated with Public Safety to offer a Self-Defense workshop.
- Throughout the fall and spring, the team focused on sensitivity-based training and maintained a presence at PDD, IDD, and 2nd Saturdays hosted by FDT. During these break-out session participants were exposed to training focused on gender and implicit bias. They designed and facilitated training specifically focused on RA’s.
- The action team that is focused on student leadership was successful in completing two iterations of the Student Leadership Circle (FA22 and SP23). They continue to explore ideas for increasing student involvement across campus.
- The action team focused on Affinity and Alliance (formerly the Heritage Month Celebrations) hosted La Grande Fiesta in the fall for Hispanic Heritage Month. They also hosted “Ain’t I A Woman” which was a core ensemble group for Black History Month. Attendance at this event was great as approximately one hundred people attended. For Women’s History Month they hosted a movie night, utilized digital signage to highlight famous women throughout history, and worked with an organization called Girls on the Run to coordinate a shoe drive to help empower young women that are affiliated with the group.

Action items for future outcomes

Prioritizing Mental Health:

- Evaluate progress toward goals and update objectives.

Sensitivity Based Training:

- Continue to create and offer On Demand Inclusion Trainings
- Evaluate progress toward goals and update objectives.

Development of Student Leadership:

- Continue to generate and implement strategies to recruit students to participate on the council.
- Evaluate progress toward goals and update objectives.

Affinity and Alliance:

- Continue to evaluate progress toward goals and update objectives.

The Inclusion Council this semester has worked through a renewal of its team structure and the various teams' goals and purposes.

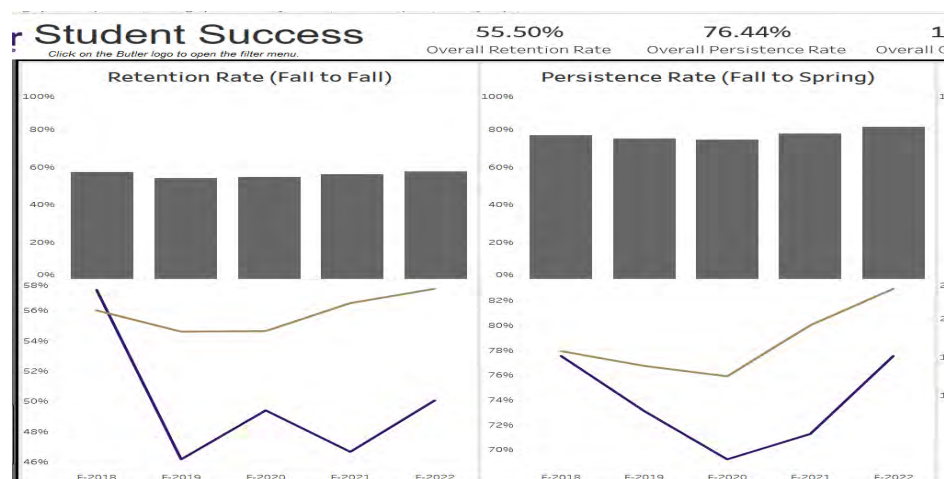

Butler has designated first generation students as the comprehensive population reflecting underserved/underrepresented learners. A first-generation learner is identified as an individual whose parents did not complete a baccalaureate degree.

Current Outcomes

In partnership with the Dean of Academic Support Services and other stakeholders, Institutional Research & Effectiveness has completed the creation of an interactive Tableau student success solution that will provide persistence, retention, and graduation rates for each fall cohort of first-generation students (and several other student populations). A sample screenshot of the solution is provided below. This solution will be made available to the leadership in student services and in Inclusion Council.



Action items for future outcomes

Student Services, in conjunction with other partners will be using the afore-mentioned solution to establish a benchmark for persistence and retention of first-generation students. Once established, this benchmark will help guide programming at student services, academics, and Inclusion Council for improving the persistence and retention rates of first generation students.

Narrative

Butler has designated first generation students as the comprehensive population reflecting underserved/underrepresented learners. A first-generation learner is identified as an individual whose parents did not complete a baccalaureate degree.

Current Outcomes

We have established a benchmark for progress.

In AY 2021, 177 out 1416 completions, or 12.5% were awarded to first generation students; for AY 2022 the figure was 156 out of 1371 (11.38%) and for AY 2023 it was 144 out of 1416 (10.85%). This makes an aggregate three-year average of 11.58% of annual completions (associates, certificates, certifications recognized by KBOR) being awarded to first-generation students.

Advising, registration, and academics will work together on focused programming to reach or exceed this benchmark during each of the three years of this strategic plan.

Action items for future outcomes

- Collaborate with groups across campus to provide resources to first-generation learners.
- Utilize first-generation faculty and staff to mentor the first-generation students across campus.
