Dr. Nathan Swink and Darren Bentley were recognized as the John & Suanne Roueche Excellence Award winners for 2018. They were selected by the Faculty Development team out of 109 nominations from Butler students and staff.

## STANDING REPORTS

<u>Student Government Association</u> – They sponsored an activities unlimited night with club sign ups. They also raised over \$400 during Pack the Power Plan night which will help students with cancer and other health issues.

#### Operational Staff - None

<u>Professional Employees</u> – Terry Sader reported that the BCCEA has created a \$500 scholarship through the Butler Foundation for students that will begin in the fall. The scholarship is 100% funded by members and the goal is to create an endowment for future semesters as well.

#### Board Finance Committee - None

<u>President's Report</u> – Dr. Krull reminded the Board of the PTK luncheon in Topeka on Thursday. Several representatives from Butler are attending along with three of the four students being recongizned. The KACCT will also host meetings for the Trustees, presidents and vice-presidents while they are in Topeka.

Twentieth Day enrollment numbers were turned in this week. We are above our goal for both credit hours and head count and now the goal is to retain the students. We are at 75,706 credit hours (our goal was 74,402) and 8077 student head count (our goal was 8273). These are the numbers we will submit for our census report to the Board of Regents.

The Higher Learning Commission visited campus last week and the Kansas State Board of Nursing will be on campus for their annual visit February 20 and 21. The Board of Regents Office of Civil Rights will also be visiting campus February 23. Lori Winningham's office is doing a great deal of preparation for that visit.

<u>Education Facilities Authority Report</u> – Because there was not a quorum present for the meeting, the meeting was cut brief with no decisions being made. The biggest event

they are looking at right now is the NJCAA national track meet being hosted here in May. Trustee Joyce pointed out that they will be having a meeting March 8<sup>th</sup> for orientation of new board members and anyone who wanted to know more about the group could attend that meeting.

Dr. Krull also mentioned that he administrators meet monthly to make sure the upkeep and long and short term financial needs are being addressed.

# **BOARD STRATEGIC DISCUSSION – ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES**

<u>Faculty Development</u> – Mark Jarvis, Director of Faculty Development shared with the board the history of the faculty development at Butler and what has changed since he took over the job in 2013. Several members of the Faculty Development Team also spoke about how the trainings, workshops and team have changed their classroom dynamics. They also invited the Board members to come in and check out their classes to see what a difference active learning has made.

## BOARD ACTION ITEMS

Master Site Facilities Plan - Last spring, the Board of Trustees approved Gravity::Works + DLR Group, Inc. to complete the Butler Master Site and Facilities Plan and a Facilities/Deferred Maintenance Study. The deferred maintenance study was initiated prior to the start of the fall semester and over the past 4 months, work has been done on the master site and facilities plan. The Board provided consensus support for the information presented at a recent work session knowing the master plan would provide a "road map" for potential future projects.

Gravity::Works + DLR Group, Inc. presented the final Master Site and Facilities Plan and Deferred Maintenance Plan for Board approval. Trustee Engelbrecht moved the plan be approved as presented. Trustee Joyce seconded. After a brief discussion acknowledging that the approval of this plan does not automatically mean funds are to be spent and that this is the first step in the strategic planning of moving forward, the motion passed unanimously.

<u>2019 Meal Plan Rate</u> - The Residence Hall Committee has analyzed the room and meal rates and is recommending the following rate structure for FY 2019. This option passes through an estimated 5.0% meal plan increase from our food service provider (Great Western Campus Dining), raises the room rates by 1.20% and caps the overall increase to the student residents at 2.6%. The meal rate increase was higher than previous years due to the academic calendar being increased by 7 days for FY19. Also, attached is rate comparison data from other local colleges and universities.
