### STANDING REPORTS

<u>Student Government Association</u> – Sierra Cargill announced that this is the super busy time of year for SGA. They are gearing up to help with Grizzly Give Back Days this Saturday. They also have the Student Life Awards and Spring Fling coming up.

Operational Staff – President Katie Zarchan announced that OpStaff is donating \$100 to the Hayley (Phipps) Peters Memorial fund. Haley was a former student who recently passed away leaving behind seven children. OpStaff also recently completed their annual silent auction as part of IDD and it was the most successful auction to date. They raised over \$2000 and Katie attributed a great deal of the success to accepting credit cards for the first time – their credit card total alone was over \$1300.

OpStaff is also helping with Grizzly Give Back Day this weekend by providing supplies and sponsoring breakfast. Several members will be traveling to Pratt Community College for the annual AKCCOP conference. They have also scheduled ReCharge for June.

<u>Professional Employees</u> – Terry Sader reported that the faculty are winding down the semester but still have plenty of work to do. He also shared how glad he was to be present when colleagues are honored for their outstanding teaching like Professor Beldon was at tonight's meeting.

<u>Board Finance Committee</u> – Trustee Engelbrecht pointed out page 188 of the board book which shows the current financial status. They have a small concern because the expenses are a little ahead of last year and the revenue is delayed some, but they are looking at some changes in institutional and academic support areas that might help balance things in the meantime.

<u>President's Report</u> – Dr. Krull reported that we have sent back our acceptance of the Assurance Argument from HLC following their recent visit. The feedback was very positive. We will need to do one interim report which we were already aware of. Once it is returned to us from the Institutional Actions Council in a couple of months, we will be able to share the full report with everyone. She also pointed out that our visit has caused the HLC to make some major changes at the national level for the four year review processes.

Jared McGinley received official notification of accreditation renewal for the business program from the Accrediting Council for Business Schools and Programs.

Enrollment for both summer and fall classes has started. We are currently at 16,500 credit hours which is about 43% towards our goal. We are also about 32% towards our headcount goal.

<u>Education Facilities Authority Report</u> – Trustee Joyce reported that the national track meet will be here next month.

### MONITORING REPORTS

<u>Division Report</u> – Dean Susan Bradley and Associate Deans Troy Nordman and Jon Craig presented the annual report for the Humanities and Social Sciences Division.

<u>Division Report</u> – Interim Dean Larry Patton and Associate Dean Julie Kobbe presented the annual report for the Fine Arts and Communications Division.

### BOARD STRATEGIC DISCUSSION – ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Acalog</u> – Vice President of Academics Lori Winningham and Peggy Krause demonstrated the new online course catalog for the Board.

### **BOARD ACTION ITEMS**

<u>2018-2019 Fire Science Housing Rates</u> – Vice President of Student Services Bill Rinkenbaugh presented the board with his recommendation for the 2.6% increase in housing fees for the Fire Science students which is inline with the rate increase approved by the Board for the other student housing. The new Fall and Spring rates would be \$900 and the Summer rate would increase to \$640. Trustee Engelbrecht moved that the fees be approved as presented. Trustee Joyce seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>Audit Services Contract</u> – Kim Sherwood presented the board with her recommendations for the Audit Contract for fiscal years ending June 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021 and June 30, 2022. The following rate proposals for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018 were received:

Allen, Gibbs & Houlik, LC	\$51,135 (3% increase each year)	
BKD CPA's & Advisors	\$56,400 (3-5% increase each year)	
Swindoll, Jenzen, Hawk & Loyd LLC	\$53,000 (4% increase each year)

Trustee Joyce moved that the Board accept the staff recommendation. Trustee Lechtenberg seconded. Discussion followed

Trustee Howell asked if we were locking into a five year contract with a 3-5% increase every year which could make a 25% increase at the end of the five years. And asked if we were locked into all five years with a new firm we didn't know. He asked that the team reconnect with the firm and clarify the termination clause as well as whether or not we will have the opportunity to end the contract after just one year instead of five.

Trustee Joyce withdrew his motion and Trustee Lechtenberg also withdrew his second.

<u>Personnel</u> – Athletic Director Todd Carter submitted contract renewals for the four basketball coaches:

- Assistant Women's Coach Abby Fawcett at an annual salary of \$41,463
- Head Women's Coach Mike Helmer at an annual salary of \$58,201 with \$2200 paid by Grizzlybackers
- Assistant Men's Coach Davon Vo at an annual salary of \$44,805
- Head Men's Coach Bryan Miller at an annual salary of \$51,450

Chair Dreiling asked for one motion to cover all four contracts. Trustee Lechtenberg so moved. Trustee Engelbrecht seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
